


Neil Verma chairs Largest Media History Ever Held at Library of Congress

Assistant Professor Neil Verma served as conference director and chair of the third <u>Radio Preservation Task Force</u> meeting at the Library of Congress and Smithsonian in Washington DC in April. The largest event of its kind, the four day conference had 80 panels and workshops and more than 350 speakers and panelists. In attendance were keynote speakers The Kitchen Sisters, Jad Abumrad of Radiolab, archivist Rick Prelinger and the Librarian of Congress, Carla Hayden. The conference brought together academics, broadcasters, government agencies, archivists and others to explore ways to preserve radio and podcasting recordings for posterity, and to launch new projects, including the Black Women in Radio historic initiative.

The film was awarded Best LBGTQ+ by Chicago Filmmaker Awards and was a semi-finalist for the Austin International Art Festival, Dublin World Film Festival, and Paris International Short Festival. In June, Bent will perform a work-inprogress of <u>PENGUIN IN YOUR EAR</u> as part of Project Y's Women in Theatre festival at ART/NY and then again at the Brick Theatre in Brooklyn in September.





The Illinois Arts Council Agency (IACA) has selected **Özge Samanci** for award of \$15K for the Artist Fellowship - Media Arts - 2023. The Artist Fellowship Program recognizes exceptional artists who have created a substantial body of work throughout their career by providing awards to support continued artistic growth.



Stephan Moore was made an <u>artist in residence</u> at the Sound Studies Institute of the University of Alberta in February/March 2023. While there, he created a new installation work, Caldera, for the SSI Gallery, performed in a <u>series of concerts</u> with the Jen Mesch Dance Conspiracy featuring his music, gave <u>an artist talk</u>, and prepared sound materials for a live-performed accompaniment to the 1925 silent film Wunder Der Schoepfung, which was <u>presented at the Block</u> <u>Cinema</u> in Evanston on April 20, in collaboration with performers Rives Collins and Scott Smallwood.

And it held screenings/a panel with **Michael Metzger** and **Jacob Smith**/the Block around climate change and mental health. Other keynotes were by professors **Ana Antic** and **Stephen Harper**. Additionally, there was a panel on melancholia and malaise in the 21st century featuring Robin Means Coleman and Miriam Petty. Finally, there were screenings of the films by PPSL student fellows, followed by a panel on mental health and the industry with **AJ Christian, Dave Tolchinsky, Eugene Park, and Adrienne Becker**.
